After the two listening open meetings of May 1st and May 6th, I have offered education and catechesis on Church Renovation on the two very important weekends and feast days of our liturgical year: Pentecost and Most Holy Trinity. This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus in the Eucharist. The Second Vatican Council reminds us that the Eucharist is the source and summit of our salvation.

In the Pastor's message of our weekly bulletins, I have given you the liturgical guidelines that will help us remodel and renovate in keeping with the laws of the church. Throughout this month of May I have continued to welcome ideas, suggestions, and dreams from members of our Santa Teresa Faith Family through e-mails, notes and personal conversations. Thank you for your ongoing feedback.

On May 31st I will meet with the Art and Environment Committee of the Diocese (I have to write this message early for publication, so the meeting hasn't happened yet).

So, throughout this lengthy process of Church Renovation, it is very important for us to entrust all our plans and dreams to the Lord and to pray that we do what God desires for us and for our future.

Interested in Becoming Catholic?

Have you ever asked yourself the following questions?

- How is the Catholic Christian faith different from other Christian religions?

If you have asked yourself any of these questions, the RCIA process will help you answer them. Life is a journey on which a person is constantly learning, growing, and changing. This process is a step in that journey and lays the groundwork, through information and experiences, in helping you decide if you want to be a member of the Catholic faith. The RCIA will provide you the opportunity to ask questions, pray, and experience what is meant by being a Catholic Christian and entering into a relationship with God and the Catholic community.

You may be wondering: Who can be part of the RCIA?

- Someone who has never been baptized.
- Someone who has been baptized in another faith tradition, but who wishes to become Catholic.
- A person who has been baptized a Catholic, but not fully catechized, that is, not having received their first Holy Communion and/or the Sacrament of Confirmation.


